- Chapter Member \$35.00. Fee includes all state benefits, regular chapter newsletters, and web forum benefits. New members may attend two meetings before paying dues.
- Associate Member \$20.00. Fee includes all regular chapter newsletters, and web forum benefits for people living 50 miles or more outside of the Idaho border. Members of this group may not participate in state contests.
- Chapter Member or Associate Member without an email address will be required to pay \$10 extra for the printing and postage of the 10 newsletters a year.

The Idaho Writer's League is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated (1) to promoting and maintaining a high standard of literary output, (2) to recognize accomplishments of Idaho writers, (3) to stimulate public respect and support for the art and profession of writing, (4) to provide a unified organization for writers and those with serious interest in writing and literary skills, (5) to encourage new literary talent, (6) to exchange ideas through the League publications and local and state meetings, (7) to stimulate writing by means of contests and recognition awards, (8) to encourage regional activity among neighboring chapters. State dues (\$15.00) include state newsletter, a state roster, and member rates at state and chapter workshops and conferences. Chapter dues (\$20.00) include chapter newsletters, chapter roster, and two chapter meetings a month (1 in July, 1 in August, and 1 in December).

- GENERAL PUBLICITY:** Place information of Chapter activities in local newspapers, etc.

- CHILDREN'S WRITING CONTEST:** Work with board in sponsoring Annual writing contest in the local schools.
